Barrett and Slotkin Tied in 7th Congressional Race! (Whitmer – Dixon Also Tied in CD 7)

LANSING, Mich. — With five days remaining before the election, Democratic incumbent Congresswoman Elissa Slotkin is locked in a dead heat with Republican state Senator Tom Barrett according to the most recent Mitchell-MIRS Poll of likely General Election voters conducted by Mitchell Research & Communications, Inc. Barrett leads by less than 1%, 48.4-47.5%.

Democrat incumbent Governor Gretchen Whitmer is also in a very tight race with GOP candidate Tudor Dixon. Dixon leads 49.3%-48.7%.

The poll was conducted using automated Interactive Voice Response (IVR) methodology calling landlines and by text messaging voter's cell phones and sending them to a SurveyMonkey poll. Data was weighted by age, gender, and party affiliation to reflect the likely voter turnout next Tuesday. The survey of N=402 Likely Voters was conducted November 2, 2022, and has a Margin of Error of + or -4.89% at the 95% level of confidence.

"We conducted a small sample survey (N=283) in the 7th Congressional District three weeks ago that showed Slotkin leading by 11percent (53%-42%). However, as we are seeing nationwide and within Michigan, there seems to be a late last minute surge to Republican candidates. That surge has moved Barrett into a statistical tie and has also moved Tudor Dixon into a tie with Governor Gretchen Whitmer. The momentum in the race would seem to indicate that if Republicans turn out in high numbers next Tuesday, Barrett may win a very close race," Steve Mitchell, president of Mitchell Research, said.

Both candidates have solidified their base, with Barrett and Slotkin getting 89% of their respective party's support. The difference is that Barrett is winning with Independents 48%-45%. As you would expect, Slotkin is leading with women (54%-43%) while Barrett leads with men (54%-40%). While Barrett has a strong lead with the fifty percent of the voters who say they will vote on election day (65%-31%) Slotkin leads with the forty-one percent who have already voted by absentee ballot (64%-32%). Slotkin also leads with voters who are planning to vote by absentee ballot (64%-34%). The crosstabs for the Governor's race look almost identical to the Congressional race.

"Mid-term elections are bad for the party in the White House, in five days we will see if Representative Slotkin can survive the midterm election," Mitchell concluded.
